## 1300 SMOKE ALARMS WARRANTY

This 2022 Upgrade Warranty is subject to the following conditions:

This 2022 warranty applies only to clients that have installed Smoke Alarm Upgrades for 2022 Legislation within the territorial limits of Queensland by 1300 Smoke Alarms. The warranty period commences from the "first date of the original install". The warranty period ends at the expiration of the 10-Year term or before as outlined below

### What's included in this Cover

1300 Smoke Alarms provides a **TEN YEAR UNLIMITED IN-HOME WARRANTY** against faulty material or workmanship, resulting in beeping and non-functioning alarms. If alarms are found to be defective, 1300 Smoke Alarms will repair or replace the unit/s under this warranty without charge to you.

### Change of Ownership

During the warranty period, this warranty is transferable to subsequent owners of the property at no additional cost. If you change ownership, please notify us to the change of ownership as soon as possible.

### What is not included

The warranty applies to reasonable and normal conditions of use only. It does not include damage as a result of misuse, neglect, unauthorised deconstruction or dismantling of the alarm/s or water damage (Home insurance may cover these items). If the property is outside of 200km from Brisbane GPO, we cannot offer an in-home warranty service and the defect alarm/s must be returned to 1300 Smoke Alarms for repair or replacement. Alarms will then be delivered once repaired or replaced. If you do not enrol your property into our annual service plan each year, the 10-year in-home warranty reverts to a 5-year in-home warranty excluding labour.

This warranty is in lieu of any other warranty either expressed or implied.
